


# Work exposure assessment in the diagnosis of occupational contact dermatitis

## What is expected and desired of exposure assessment


### **Expected**

- Derive exposure estimates for each exposure scenario
- All routes and combinations
- Duration and frequency according to operational conditions

#### **Desired**

- Transparent
- Flexible
- Interpretable and consistent
- Relevant, realistic (but in context of final exposure scenario)
- Compatible with registration needs and other processes –
- restriction, authorisation well described for screening
- Validation of exposure estimates and modifying factors
- Uses appropriate terminology
- Support production of ES for many uses in many dossiers

## **Chasing exposure assessment**

234 total abstracts identified = 182 abstracts plus 52 by hand search

41 papers suitable for further appraisal

7 papers formed the baseline




## Three key Q of the quest for an A

- Which are suitable sources of information for exposure assessment when diagnosing OCD?
  - ▶ Product labels, MSDS, product DB, other available DB, specialty handbooks
  - ▶ Inquiring manufacturer or supplier, conducting a workplace visit, conducting a chemical analysis of the product
- What would be a recommendable chart flow for exposure assessment when diagnosing OCD?
- How to tackle challenges regarding lack of information in material safety data sheets?
  - Conduct a workplace visit
  - Ask employer for reports on formerly conducted risk assessment

  - address the issue of EA more profoundly, search the gray literature too before designing recommendations,
  - see to which extent is EA a part of risk assessment and to which extent do they collide
  - provide a set of recommendations for WV
